CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUNIOR MEMBERS

Sleford Maltsters Archery Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

As a member of Sleford Maltsters Archery Club you are expected to follow the junior club rules:

- Remember... when you are asked to finish shooting and pack up your equipment by a club member please respect this request and do so as quickly as possible
- As a junior member you must participate within the rules of archery and respect coaches and other officials and their decisions
- It's important for you to respect everyone else at the club at all times – so, this means things like giving other archers space to shoot on the line; respecting their equipment which shouldn't be touched unless you are given permission to do so and try to avoid chatting and talking unnecessarily on the shooting line too because it can easily upset and disturb other archers
- Don't forget, you should arrive in plenty of time to help set up equipment for the start of shooting and training on club nights – remember, you must wear suitable kit for training sessions, i.e.; Club T-shirt and when shooting outside have a jumper and waterproof in case of a change in the weather
- You need to pay any fees for training or events promptly – you may need to remind your parents or guardian!
- As a junior member you are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the Club premises or whilst representing the Club
- Also... you aren't allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the Club at competitions
- If you are entering a competition, it's important to inform your coach (if you have one) or team manager if you are going to be late
